





GUIDELINES

FOR THE FOREIGN POLICY REPORT (FPR)

A) Overview of the delegate and his delegation:

- Name of the delegate and their delegation (country, organization, etc.)
- Flag, image, or emblem in the upper right margin
- Fundamental details regarding the country or entity represented include: currency, official language, population density, capital city, governmental structure, and a concise overview of the delegation and its function within the Model United Nations.

B) Economic, social, and cultural landscape:

- An overview of the present economic conditions of the country or entity in question.
- Key economic indicators (Gross Domestic Product, inflation rate, unemployment rate).
- Significant economic sectors.
- Social context: prevailing social issues (poverty, inequality, education, etc.) and enacted social policies.
- Cultural context: significant cultural attributes and cultural and tourism heritage.

C) The nation's foreign and domestic policy:

- Foreign policy: Objectives and priorities of foreign policy, relations with other nations or regional blocs, engagement in international organizations.
- Domestic Policy: Government framework and political system, principal domestic policies (education, healthcare, security, etc.), prevailing domestic challenges.

D) Supplementary information:

- Any supplementary information that the delegate deems pertinent to his or her role or nation.
- Targeted initiatives or proposals aimed at tackling global or regional challenges.

- Line spacing 2.0 (double).
- One-inch margins on each side (2.54 cm/l in).
