



REGULATION

GENERAL CONDUCT "GRAND INTERNATIONAL"

Approved by MUNYCH Association on July 14, 2025

I. Identification and Registration: All participants must visibly wear their official identification badge, provided by the organization, at all times. This badge is personal and non-transferable and will be required for access to the facilities, committees, breaks, and social or academic activities. For security reasons, entry is strictly prohibited for unaccredited individuals.

II. Diplomatic Conduct and Protocol: During all sessions, committees, conferences, and activities related to the event, Delegates, Secretariat members, teaching advisors, and other participants must maintain diplomatic conduct based on respect, formality, and courtesy. Appropriate language, both spoken and written, as well as a professional and collaborative attitude, are expected. Inappropriate, aggressive, or disrespectful behavior will be grounds for disciplinary action.

III. Prohibition of Discriminatory Conduct: MUNYCH Association and GRAND International promote inclusion and diversity. No discriminatory conduct will be tolerated based on gender, age, religion, nationality, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, or any other difference. Any act that violates this principle will result in sanctions and possible immediate expulsion from the event.

IV. Attire and Dress Code: All participants must dress in formal or business attire during the event and visits to official venues or government offices. Failure to comply with this requirement may limit access to sessions or official ceremonies. Participants are requested to maintain a neat and professional appearance at all times.



V. Punctuality and Attendance: Punctuality is a fundamental value for the trip or academic event and its activities. Delegates and their companions must arrive on time and in the proper manner at the start of each session, ceremony, or activity. Delays or absences without justification will not be the responsibility of the association and could cause delays or non-attendance at the activities. Any unforeseen circumstances must be reported to the Senior Management Group.

VI. Staying in Physical Facilities or Virtual Rooms: Delegates must remain within the designated areas of the event or academic activity and may not leave the facilities without authorization. The Organizing Committee is not responsible for any situation that occurs outside the official event venue or at times not specified in the program.

VII. Meals, Free Time, and Individual Tours: If the student(s) attend the event or academic activity accompanied by a tutor or faculty member, with their authorization, they may jointly use their free time to visit any tourist site they wish during the designated times. Likewise, they are free to choose where to purchase their meals, and free time will be allocated for this purpose. (*Only for in-person international experiences*).

VIII. Conduct that Interferes with the Event: Any behavior that disrupts order, concentration, or the safety of the event will be penalized. This includes: constant interruptions, disrespect, sabotage, verbal or physical aggression, use of prohibited substances, or damage to the facilities. Serious offenses will result in the participant's immediate expulsion and official notification to their educational institution or supervisors.

IX. Use of Facilities and Third-Party Property: All attendees must respect the rules of the host school, venue, or hotel, including furniture, materials, common areas, and safety signage. Any damage caused to property belonging to the school or third parties will be the direct responsibility of the participant and/or their guardian.



X. Authority of the Secretariat and Organizing Committee: Decisions issued by the General Secretariat and the Organizing Committee are final and binding on all participants. Any dispute will be resolved in accordance with the principles of this Code of Conduct.

XI. Health, Safety, and Responsibility: If any participant has a medical condition, allergy, treatment, or ailment requiring special attention, they must inform the Organizing Committee and the responsible faculty advisor beforehand. The participant must remain under the supervision of their teacher, advisor, or chaperone during the event. MUNYCH Association is not responsible for accidents, losses, damages, or unfortunate situations beyond its direct control or resulting from non-compliance with these regulations.
